

In 2019, Dalhousie was one of the first universities in North America to replace its traditional university mace, which is used as the ceremonial object to open and close each convocation ceremony. The New Dawn Staff of Place and Belonging was created with contributions by artists from Mi'kmaq, African Nova Scotian and other communities to celebrate that Dalhousie is part of a larger geographic and cultural place of diversity and inclusion.
